



Dr. Valerie Batts is a clinical psychologist who has provided consultation and technical assistance on challenging inequities to organizations, groups and individuals since 1984. Valerie grew up in Rocky Mount, N.C. She became engaged injustice issues as a child of the civil rights movement. She nurtured these roots while an undergraduate at the University of NC at Chapel Hill. She was Editor of the Black Ink (1973) and Minister of Information for the Black Student Movement (1974).

Valerie received an honorary Dr. of Divinity Degree in 2010 from the Episcopal Divinity School and the Distinguished Alumni Award in the field of Community Service from UNC-Chapel Hill in 2006 for outstanding contributions to humanity in striving to build a society that overcomes racism, sexism and ageism and seeks to achieve social justice for all. In 2023, she received the Harvey E. Beech Outstanding Alumni from UNC-CH.
